Dear Parents and Carers,

This morning you will have received a communication from me regarding the proposed phased closure of our Sixth Form provision at Clyst Vale. I want to emphasise, that this decision has not been taken lightly. If the proposal goes ahead, it will be a significant loss to both the College and the local community. Our Sixth Form students enjoy an excellent 16 – 18 experience. A testament to this is our annual Year 13 prom, which takes place tonight. It is a wonderful evening where staff and students celebrate the end of an era and wish our students well on the next stage of their academic journey.

Unfortunately, increasing competition from other local providers who can offer a broader range of qualifications has led to the significant decrease in student numbers over a sustained period. Combined with a lack of funding, maintaining our Sixth Form provision is no longer financially viable and would be at the detriment of the majority of learners at the College. Please take some time to read the consultation document so you understand the rationale behind this proposal. It is important to note that no decision has been made yet. Stakeholder views will be considered by both the Local Governing Board and the Department for Education Regions Group before any final decision.

If you would like to discuss this proposal, there will be an opportunity next Thursday evening from 5 pm – 7pm to speak with me or other representatives of the Governing Board. Rest assured, we are committed to ensuring all current and prospective Sixth Form students will continue to receive the high quality education we have always provided.

In other news, this week has been filled with exciting activities, especially for Year 10 students who had the opportunity to participate in Geography fieldwork, Drama performances or careers events, including a visit to Bicton College. Additionally, 40 Year 9 students took part in the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh walk to Killerton. The feedback from staff was that these students were a credit to the College. Finally, the highlight of the week was the hustings organised by Mrs Padden, which you can read more about this later in the newsletter. All these activities reflect the dedication of our staff who invest significant time and effort to provide these opportunities.

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Reporting an Absence

Parents are expected to inform us of their child's absence before 9.00 a.m. on each day of absence providing the reason for absence. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness. If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. In addition, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if your child is absent from College due to illness.

Lateness

The school day (first registration session) starts at 8.50 am, all students are expected to be in their classroom at this time.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. We ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment if they can.

Please give the school as much notice as possible, at least two weeks' notice is useful.

If the appointment requires the pupil to leave during the day, they must be signed out by an adult listed on the student's record at the main reception.

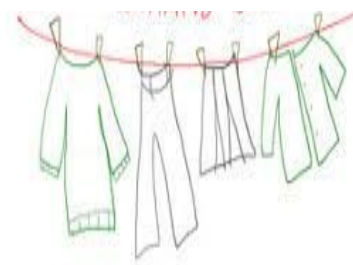
